Course Title

Reading Practice from Late Antiquity: Selected Passages from Ammianus Marcellinus' Historical Work

Course Description

This course focuses on the reading and interpretation of selected passages from Ammianus Marcellinus' *Res gestae*.

Ammianus Marcellinus, the last major Roman historian, produced the *Res gestae*, the most important source for the history of the Roman Empire in the fourth century CE. Continuing Tacitus' *Historiae*, his originally 31-book work covered Roman history from the reign of Nerva to the Battle of Adrianople. Its central focus is the account of wars and Roman politics, enriched with excursions into natural science, ethnography, geography, and social history.

The extant books (14–31) demonstrate that Ammianus wrote in a uniquely authentic manner, relying both on numerous historical sources and his own personal experiences as an eyewitness to many events. Covering the period from 353 to 378, this makes his work of unparalleled historical value.

The course aims at a comprehensive treatment of the selected texts—linguistic, stylistic, and historical—supported by relevant modern scholarship. It is designed to deepen students' knowledge of fourth-century Roman history and strengthen their Latin language skills.

Requirements

- Regular and active participation in class
- Preparation of assigned texts in advance
- Presentation based on a chosen item of secondary literature
- If necessary, a final written or oral examination
